



# BEAVER COUNTY BEHAVIORAL HEALTH Sponsored CRS Training Series SPRING 2024- Moon Township, PA

The new CRS/CFRS training series will be held on Friday and Saturday for 5 weeks beginning on 2/21/25 and concluding on 3/22/25.

## COSTS:

- The class is \$200 for any student to attend (Due prior to first class **payable to Gateway Rehab Center**)
- CRS application is \$150 (Requires lived experience in recovery – Due with application to PCB at completion – payable to PA Cert Board)
- CFRS application is \$150 (Requires lived experience as a family member- Due with application to PCB at completion- payable to PA Cert Board)
  - Student may apply for either or both.
- Notary fees for application (varies but is nominal -\$10-\$15, typically)

## To Apply for enrollment into course:

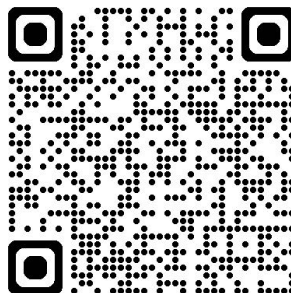
1. Candidates must begin by creating an account at <https://www.pacertboard.org/>
  - Next, complete the application at <https://www.pacertboard.org/class/recovery-specialist-312>. The class is currently set to “private” and the password to access the application is **BCBH2025**
2. Students must also have a login on DDAP Training Management System, which can be created or accessed here: <https://apps.ddap.pa.gov/tms/Logon.aspx>

3. Once approved, students will receive an email from PCB acknowledging their approval to attend the class and a welcome email from the instructor with more information about the class, fees, directions, etc.

4. Students may test for CRS Certification after completing 78 hours\* of training including 66 classroom hours and 12 hours of work outside the classroom. **It is imperative that students attend each class, any absences will affect your ability to successfully complete the class and take the exam.**

\*The hours listed here are the minimum hours necessary to complete the curriculum. Actual classroom time may vary from week to week depending on class flow. Students should arrive by 8:45am each Friday and Saturday morning.

	The second session in the RSC will conclude the discussion of the role of the Recovery Specialist (RS) and begin the review of communication and professional skills of the RS	
February 28, 2025	<b>RSC03 - Communication and Motivational Interviewing</b>	<b>7</b>
	The third session of the RSC will conclude the discussion of the role of the Recovery Specialist (RS) and introduce Motivational Interviewing.	
March 1, 2025	<b>RSC04 - Stages of Change and Ethical Considerations</b>	<b>6.5</b>
	The fourth session of the RSC will continue the discussion of Motivational Interviewing and review the Stages of Change. Ethical responsibility and professionalism will also be discussed.	
March 7, 2025	<b>RSC05 - Ethical Responsibility and Professionalism</b>	<b>6.5</b>
	The fifth session of the RSC will continue to discuss ethical responsibility and professionalism for the Recovery Specialist	
March 8, 2025	<b>RSC06 - Substance Use Knowledge</b>	<b>6</b>
	The sixth session of the RSC will be an in-depth discussion on substance use	
March 13, 2025	<b>RSC07 - Co-Occurring/Mental Health and Recovery Planning/Collaboration</b>	<b>6.5</b>
	The seventh session of the RSC will discuss co-occurring disorders and mental health, as well as begin a discussion on recovery planning and collaboration.	
March 14, 2025	<b>RSC08 - Recovery Planning/Collaboration and Other Types of Support</b>	<b>6.5</b>
	The eighth session of the RSC will conclude discussion of recovery planning and collaboration. Additionally, other types of support a recovery specialist can provide will be reviewed, including non-clinical support groups, digital recovery support, and advocacy.	
March 21, 2025	<b>RSC09 - Advocacy and Cultural Competency</b>	<b>7</b>
	The ninth session of the RSC will conclude discussion on advocacy and begin a discussion on cultural competency.	
March 22, 2025	<b>RSC10 - Cultural Competency, Safety and Self-Care</b>	<b>7</b>
	The tenth and final session in the RSC will conclude the discussion of cultural competency and discuss safety and self-care for the recovery specialist.
